

PROTOCOLS FOR ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITES OR MUSEUMS

For their own protection, visitors should comply with the following rules:

- ❖ All visitors are required to stay at least 2 meters apart from visitors from different households/family groups when touring an archaeological site; and indoors, when in the waiting room at the ticket booth.
- ❖ All visitors should avoid visiting if they have symptoms of COVID-19, have been diagnosed with COVID-19 within the past 14 days, or have been in close contact with someone infected with or experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 within the past 14 days.
- ❖ All visitors should wear a face mask and frequently use hand sanitizer throughout the visit. (both are strongly recommended).
- ❖ Visitors will comply with floor markings when waiting in indoor and outdoor environments.
- ❖ All visitors accessing the archaeological sites or museums must undergo temperature screening and disinfect the soles of their shoes. Visitors with a temperature of 38°C or more will be denied entry.
- ❖ Tourist guides, at all times, must follow any instructions given by the staff of archaeological sites and museums and are obliged to wear face masks throughout guided tours. All visitors should follow directions from staff and signage for physical distancing, reducing contact, and other guidelines for use of facilities.
- ❖ Tourist guides must accompany their groups of visitors at all times.
- ❖ The number of people on the tour cannot exceed 08 people. (either 07 passengers + 01 guide)
- ❖ A restricted number of visitors will be allowed to enter each archaeological site (depending on its size). The maximum number of visitors allowed in archaeological sites and museums (depending on their size) must be strictly followed. Staff will be present to regulate the entry-exit flow of visitors.
- ❖ All visitors are required to make a reservation in advance.
